IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to authorize cities and towns to permit the use of lunch wagons on public ways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. The Mayor and Aldermen of any city, or Se2 lectmen of any town; may, if in their opinion public con3 venience so requires, license any reputable person upon the
4 payment of an annual license fee, to be fixed by said li5 censing authority, to maintain a vehicle for the sale of food
6 in such part of any public way and during such hours as the
7 licensing authority may designate, provided that public
8 travel is not incommoded thereby, and no other or further
9 license shall be required for this purpose. Any such license

10 may be revoked, for reasonable cause, at any time, by the 11 licensing authority.

Sect. 2. No license, as aforesaid, shall be granted to use 2 any part of any public way the fee in which is not owned by 3 the city or town, against the objection of the owners of the 4 land abutting on that part of the way.
