STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT for the assessment of a State Tax for the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, amounting to the sum of one million two hundred eighty-six thousand six hundred fifty-one dollars and fifty-five cents.

Whereas, All taxes upon real and personal property in this State are assessed as of April first and in the greater portion of the municipalities the assessments are completed during the months of April and May of each year, and

Whereas, It is necessary that the warrants for State taxes shall be transmitted by the Treasurer of State to the assessors of the several cities, towns and plantations as soon as April first as practicable in order that the taxes may be promptly assessed so that the cities, towns and plantations may receive sufficient revenue for current expenses, and

Whereas, In the opinion of the Legislature, these facts render the immediate passage of this act necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and constitute an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. That each city, town, plantation, or any other
 2 place hereinafter named, within this State, shall be assessed
 3 and pay the several sums with which they respectively stand
 4 charged in the following lists; the same being in addition
 5 to the poll tax of one cent on each poll, a tax of three mills
 6 on the dollar of the present State valuation for the current
 7 disbursements of the treasury for the year one thousand
 8 nine hundred and nine; and for the school mill tax pro-
 9 vided by section 124 of chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes,
 10 as amended by chapter III of the Public Laws of 1907.

Sect. 2. The treasurer of this state shall, in the month of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine, send his warrant with a copy of this tax act, directed to the mayor and aldermen, selectmen or assessors of each city, town or plantation, taxed as aforesaid, requiring them respectively to assess, in dollars and cents, the sum so charged, according to the provisions of the law for the assessment of taxes and to add the amount of such tax to the amount of county and town taxes, to be by them assessed in each city, town and plantation or other place, respectively.

Sect. 3. The treasurer of state in his said warrant, shall require the said mayor and aldermen, selectmen or assessors, respectively, to pay or to issue their several warrant or warrants requiring the collectors of their several cities, towns and plantations, to collect and pay in to the treasurer of their respective cities, towns and plantations, the sum against said cities, towns and plantations, respectively, in this act contained, which said respective treasurer shall pay to the state treasurer on or before the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and said mayor, selectmen and assessors, respectively, shall return a certificate of the names of such collectors, with the sums which each collector may be required to collect, to said state treasurer, sometime before the first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Sect. 4. When the time for the payment of a state tax to the treasurer of state has expired, and it is unpaid, the treasurer of state shall give notice thereof to the municipal officers of any delinquent town, and unless such tax shall be paid within sixty days, the treasurer of state may issue his warrant to the sheriff of the county, requiring him to levy, by distress and sale, upon the real and personal property of any of the inhabitants of the town; and the sheriff or his deputy shall execute such warrants, observing the regulations provided for satisfying warrants against deficient collectors, as prescribed by chapter ten of the revised statutes.

Sect. 5. When any state tax assessed upon any city or town remains unpaid, such city or town is precluded from drawing from the state treasurer the school funds set apart for such city or town, so long as such tax remains unpaid.

Sect. 6. In view of the emergency set forth in the preamble, this act, having received the vote of two-thirds of the full membership of each branch of the Legislature, shall take effect when approved.
