AMENDMENT "A" to Senate Document No. 471.

Amend Senate Document No. 471 by adding the following section after Section No. 19:

No dog shall be allowed by its owner to roam the pastures or woods of other people, hunting independently, or without the supervision of his owner, unless the ground is covered with snow. Upon knowledge of such independent hunting by any dog, the municipal officers of the city, town or plantation shall promptly notify, in writing, the owner, to keep his dog on his own premises or muzzle or dispose of him. If the owner of the dog refuses or neglects to obey such notice, he shall be fined a sum not exceeding five dollars and costs. And if the dog still continues to roam at large, independent of its owner, the dog shall be killed by order of the municipal officers, unless otherwise promptly disposed of by his owner.
