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

RESOLVE, in favor of Daniel R. Palmer of Buckfield.

Resolved, That there be paid to Daniel R. Palmer of Buck2 field, in the County of Oxford, the sum of two dollars per
3 month, in addition to the sum of six dollars per month, now
4 received by said Palmer, under chapter one hundred and
5 twenty-five of the resolves of nineteen hundred and seven,
6 payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military
7 pensions and beginning July the first, nineteen hundred and
8 nine, and to continue during the pleasure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Daniel R. Palmer, a resident of Buckfield, is now seventyone years old, the receives thirty dollars per month from the
Federal Government and six dollars from the State, under a
Resolve in the Legislature of 1007. He enlisted in the 23rd
Maine Volunteer Infantry, Company C. He is totally blind;
has double hernia, double hydrocele, heart and kidney troubles
and acute rheumatism. He is practically helpless and has to
have someone to care for him the whole time. He has no
property, but himself and wife have to depend entirely upon
his pension.
