## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to extend the privileges of secondary instruction to youths resident in unorganized townships.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Any youth who resides with a parent or guard2 ian in any unorganized township in which schools are reg3 ularly maintained may attend any secondary school in the
4 State to which he may gain entrance by permission of those
5 having charge thereof, provided said school shall be of
6 standard grade approved by the State Superintendent of
7 Public Schools. In such case the tuition of such youth not
8 to exceed thirty dollars annually shall be paid by the State
9 under such provisions and regulations as may be made by
10 the State Superintendent and approved by the Governor
11 and Council.
