STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT authorizing towns to prohibit the sale of cigarettes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Whoever, by himself, his clerk, servant or 2 agent, directly or indirectly sells, offers for sale or has in 3 his possession with intent to sell any cigarette within the 4 limits of any city, town or plantation after such city by 5 vote of its city government or such town or plantation by 6 vote at any regular or special town meeting shall have 7 accepted the provisions of this act, shall be punished by 8 fine not exceeding fifty dollars or by imprisonment not ex-9 ceeding sixty days. Trial justices and municipal and police 10 courts shall have jurisdiction of offenses arising under this 11 section.
