RESOLVE in favor of the town of Mount Chase.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

- 2 sum of fifty-seven dollars and ninety-two cents, to reim-
- 3 burse the town of Mount Chase for money expended in
- 4 nineteen hundred seven on account of William Russell.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

William Russell was hired by the Eastern Manufacturing Company of Bangor, and came to Maine from Boston, Mass., to go into the woods with a crew of men. About 26 miles beyond Patten he turned back, became lost and died from hunger. The body was found by some fishermen two miles from Sebois Farm, which is 20 miles from Mt. Chase. Mr. C. E. Palmer, proprietor of said farm, got the body and brought it to said town of Mount Chase. The above sum is for Mr. Palmer's expense and expense of sheriff, undertaker and sexton.
