STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of Macwahoc Plantation for one hundred dollars on account of State road constructed in the year nineteen hundred and seven.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be and here-2 by is appropriated to reimburse Macwahoc Plantation on 3 account of State road constructed in the year 1907. . • . •

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The legislature of 1907 appropriated money for the repair of two bridges in Macwahoc Plantation over Molunkus Stream and Macwahoc Stream. Both these bridges are located on the Old State Military Road from Mattawamkeag to Houlton and are State bridges, having been built and always maintained by the State.

Macwahoc Plantation raised \$200 in the year 1907 for State road expecting to receive \$100 from the State under the general provision for State aid.

On account of the provision of section 103, chapter 23, of the R. S., in force at that time, but since repealed, forbidding towns receiving State aid by special resolve, to receive the State aid for roads, there was doubt whether the sum of \$100 due under the general road law could be legally paid and it was not paid.
