## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in the Bagaduce River and its tributaries in the towns of Castine, Penobscot and Brooksville in the County of Hancock.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall use any weir, seine, trap or

- 2 any other contrivance in catching, fishing for or taking fish
- 3 in the Bagaduce River or any of its tributaries in the towns
- 4 of Castine, Penobscot and Brooksville in the County of
- 5 Hancock, except by the use of gill nets and permanent
- 6 weirs, with not less than fifty (50) poles, constructed of
- 7 lathes, brush, wire or twine.

Sect. 2. Any person who violates any provision of this 2 act shall be punished by a fine of not less than three hun-3 dred dollars (\$300) or more than five hundred dollars 4 (\$500) for each offense.
