STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE to protect and maintain the Peace and Quiet of the House.

Resolved, That it is the sense of the House, and it hereby 2 so declares, that any member thereof who shall dare say 3 "Herring," or "Alien Pauper," between now and the day of 4 final adjournment, shall be seized by the sergeant-at-arms, 5 Mr. Patrick Fitzgerald, and by him be safely held until the 6 meeting of the House in mock session, when said offender 7 against the peace and quiet of the House shall be dealt with 8 as the Court may order, and that pending the convening 9 of the Honorable Mock Court said offender be incarcerated 10 in Staples Hall, H. F. T. F. M., at Pownalboro.
