Petition of Bayville Improvement Association for charter for Village Corporation, accompanied by bill for charter for Bayville Village Corporation.

Boston, Mass., January 5th, 1911.

To the Honorable Senators and House of Representatives of the 75th Legislature of the State of Maine:

We, the undersigned, officers and directors of the Bayville Improvement Association, respectfully ask that you grant to the residents of that part of Boothbay Harbor in the county of Lincoln and State of Maine which is described as follows: Commencing at the southerly point of the boundary line between the town of Boothbay and Boothbay Harbor, on Linekins Bay, so called, and extending northerly along said boundary line to a point where the line extended along a certain stone wall which runs east and west near the fork of the main road would intersect this town line; thence extending westerly along this line to said stone wall extended east and west to a point

which would mark its intersection with the westerly line extended of lots 22, 23, 24 and 25, according to the plan of Bayville made by Tristham Griffin; thence along the westerly line of lots 22, 23, 24 and 25 to the low water mark of Linekins Bay; thence along the low water mark of Linekins Bay to the point of beginning, a charter for a Village corporation within the above described limits.
