STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section One of Chapter 244 of the Public Laws of 1909 relating to the transmission of power beyond the confines of the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section One of Chapter 244 of the Public Laws 2 of 1909 is hereby amended by striking out from said section 3 all after the word "purposes" in the eighth line thereof so 4 that said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. No corporation, unless expressly author- 6 ized so to do by special act of legislation, shall transmit or 7 convey beyond the confines of the state for the purpose of 8 furnishing power, heat or light, any electric current generat-

9 ed directly or indirectly by any water power in this state;
10 nor sell or furnish, directly or indirectly, to any person, firm
11 or corporation, any electric current so generated to be trans-
12 mitted or conveyed beyond the confines of the state for any
13 of such purposes.'
