STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter two hundred and eighty-four of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and nine, relating to the Westbrook Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of Chapter two hundred and eighty-
2 four of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred
3 and nine is hereby amended by inserting after the word "be"
4 in the third line of said section the words 'an attorney at
5 law,' and by striking out the word "two" in the tenth line
6 of said section and inserting in place thereof the word
7 'three'; so that said section, as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The Governor by and with the consent of the
9 Council shall appoint a recorder of the municipal court for
10 the City of Westbrook, who shall be an attorney at law and
11 a resident of Westbrook, and shall hold office for the term
12 of four years.

In case of the absence of the judge from the court room
14 or when the judge shall be interested as party or attorney or
15 when the judge shall be sick or away or when the office of
16 judge shall have become vacant, the recorder shall have and
17 exercise all the powers of the judge.

Such recorder shall receive an annual salary of three hun-
19 dred dollars, in full for all services as such recorder, which
20 salary shall be paid him in quarterly payments from the
21 county treasury of the county of Cumberland.'
