STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Carthage.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and seventy dollars be and hereby is appropriated to the town of Carthage, said sum being reimbursement on account of a free high school maintained by that town during the year ending July 1, 1911.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In the accompanying resolve in favor of the town of Carthage for two hundred and seventy dollars the following statement of facts is submitted:

The free high school maintained by the town of Carthage during the year ending July 1, 1911, was terminated by the superintending school committee after a session of twenty-seven (27) weeks. Because of this action the length of the school year was less than the minimum required by law (section 1, chapter 71, P. L. 1909), and the expenditure for instruction also was below the legal minimum. For these reasons state aid has not been previously certified in the usual method.
