STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE to aid in repairing Springfield Normal Academy building.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated to the 2 trustees of Springfield Normal Academy for the use and 3 benefit of that institution the sum of one thousand dollars 4 for the year nineteen hundred thirteen; the same to be expended under the direction of said trustees for necessary 6 repairs to the school building of said institution.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1866 the two school districts, east and west of Clark hill, in Springfield, were united and took the name of school district No. 3, and the present school building built.

In 1885 the Normal school was definitely established and incorporated February 21, 1901.

From 1866 to the present time all repairs to the building have been made by the town without aid from the State.

Recently by voluntary subscription a hard wood floor has been laid in the assembly room.

The registration the present winter term is forty-eight.

The building at the present time is badly in need of thorough repairs in order that it may be preserved and serve the purposes for which it is intended.
