STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Paragraph three (III) of Section six of Chapter nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to the taxation of musical instruments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. Paragraph three (III) of Section six of Chapter nine of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by striking out the word "fifty," in the last line of said paragraph,
and inserting the words 'six hundred' in the place of said
word "fifty," so that said paragraph as hereby amended, shall
read as follows:

'III. The household furniture of each person, not exceed-

8 ing two hundred dollars to any one family, his wearing ap-9 parel, farming utensils, mechanics' tools necessary for his 10 business, and musical instruments not exceeding in value six 11 hundred dollars to one family.'
