#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 17, Chapter 65 of the Revised Statutes, relating to administering oaths.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 17, Chapter 65 of the Revised Statutes

- 2 is hereby amended by striking out the words "and recorded"
- 3 in the eleventh line of said section so that it shall read as
- 4 follows:

'Sect. 17. All oaths required to be taken by executors, ad-

- 6 ministrators, trustees or guardians, and all oaths required
- 7 of commissioners of insolvency, appraisers and dividers of
- 8 estates, or of any other persons in relation to any proceed-

9 ing in the probate court, or to perpetuate the evidence of the publication of any order of notice, or of any notice of the time and place of sale of real estate by license of a judicial 12 or probate court, may be administered by the judge or register of probate, by any justice of the peace, or by any 14 woman appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, to administer oaths in the state; and a 16 certificate thereof, when taken out of court, shall be returned into the registry of probate, and there filed. When 18 executors, administrators, guardians and trustees reside 19 without the state, they may make oath to the truth of accounts, before a notary public, a commissioner for the State 21 of Maine or a United States consul.'
