STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Betsey Storer.

Resolved, That there be paid to Betsey Storer, widow of 2 Albert Storer, late of Mount Vernon, county of Kennebec 3 and State of Maine, the sum of six dollars per month, pay-4 able quarterly, from the fund appropriated for military pensions, and to begin January first, nineteen hundred and thir-6 teen, in addition to the amount already being paid her, as 7 provided by a resolve passed by the Legislature of nineteen 8 hundred and seven.

STATEMENT OF FACTS IN CONNECTION WITH BETSEY STORER.

Mrs. Betsey Storer is an old lady, upwards of eighty; lives alone, and has no one to look to for her support. At the session of the Legislature of 1907 she was given a pension of four dollars per month.

At the time of receiving this pension she owned a small farm which was not of much value, and since that time she has been obliged to sell it in order to provide means for her support.

The proceeds from the farm being already partly used up, unless she gets the pension as asked for she will become an object of charity ere long.

Mrs. Storer is an honorable old lady and stands high in her community, and is deserving of all the assistance we are able to render her.
