*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine, in Legislature assembled:*

The subscribers hereto, citizens and voters of the town of Thomaston, respectfully petition that the following may be enacted into the statute law of the state, viz:

“It shall be unlawful to take or catch smelts in the waters of St. George’s river, or its tributaries, except that they may be taken therein by hook and line.

“They may also be taken in said river and its tributaries by dip nets from the twenty-fifth day of March in each year to the twenty-fifth day of April, and by bag-nets from the first day of December to the first day of March.

“All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.”
