STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section fifty, Chapter ninety-three of the Revised Statutes of the State of Maine, as amended by Chapter twenty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, relating to Liens.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty of Chapter ninety-three of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter twenty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word "or" in the second line of said section as amended, and before the word "pulpwood" the

6 words 'cutting, peeling, yarding or hauling', so that said sec-
7 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 50. Whoever labors at cutting, peeling or hauling
9 hemlock bark or cutting, yarding or hauling cordwood or
10 cutting, peeling, yarding or hauling pulpwood or any wood
11 used in the manufacture of pulpwood, or at cooking for per-
12 sons engaged in such labor, has a lien thereon for the amount
13 due for his personal service and the service performed by
14 his team, which takes precedence of all other claims and
15 continues for thirty days after the contract is completed and
16 may be enforced by attachment.'
