STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to incorporate The Kingman Telephone Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. E. A. Buck of Macwohoc, Maine, J. Frank
2 Campbell, C. S. Allen and H. M. Boyd of Kingman, Maine,
3 their associates and successors are hereby made a body
4 corporate by the name of The Kingman Telephone Com-
5 pany, with all the rights, power and privileges, and subject
6 to all duties and obligations of similar corporations under
7 the general laws of this state, with power by that name to
8 sue and be sued, to establish all by-laws and regulations
9 for the management of its affairs not repugnant to the laws

10 of this state and to do and perform any and all legal acts
11 incident to similar corporations.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to own,
2 construct, maintain and operate telephone line or lines any-
3 where in the town of Kingman in the county of Penobscot,
4 and from any points in said Kingman to and through the
5 adjoining town of Macwohoc in the county of Aroostook,
6 after having obtained consent of said municipalities, and
7 said corporations shall have the right to locate and con-
8 struct its lines upon and along any public highway or
9 bridge in said town, but in such a way as not to incom-
10 mode or endanger the customary use thereof; and shall
11 have the power to establish and collect tolls on said lines,
12 but not to assume any bills or indebtedness without unani-
13 mous consent of the share or stock holders.

Sect. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized and em-
2 powered to connect its lines with those of any other tele-
3 phone company or corporation on such terms as may be
4 mutually agreed upon or to sell or lease its line or lines
5 of telephone and property in whole or in part, to any other
6 telephone company or corporation, as provided by law or
7 upon such terms as may be agreed by the contracting
8 parties, or may purchase or lease any other line or lines
9 of telephone upon such terms and conditions as may be
10 agreed by the parties thereto; or may purchase, hold, sell
11 and convey real estate and personal property necessary for
12 the purpose contemplated in this chapter.

Sect. 4. If the land of any individual or corporation is
2 taken under this act, and the parties cannot agree upon the
3 damages occasioned thereby, they shall be estimated, se-
4 cured and paid for in the manner provided in the case of
5 land taken for railroads.

Sect. 5. The capital stock of the said corporation shall
2 be one thousand dollars, divided into forty shares of twenty-
3 five dollars each for the sole purpose of owning, leasing,
4 constructing, maintaining and operating the line or lines of
5 telephone hereby authorized, and contemplated.

Sect. 6. Any one of the incorporators named in this act
2 may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a
3 written notice signed by himself, postage paid, to each of
4 the other incorporators, seven days at least before the day
5 of the meeting, naming the time, place and purpose of such
6 meeting, and at such meeting a president, secretary, treas-
7 urer and directors may be chosen, by-laws adopted, present
8 amount of capital stock fixed, and any corporate business
9 transacted.
