IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the Central Maine Power  
Company.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. The action of said Central Maine Power Com-  
2 pany in purchasing the plants, property, rights, privileges  
3 and franchises of the Waterville & Fairfield Railway &  
4 Light Company, the Union Gas & Electric Comapny, the  
5 Bingham Electric Company, the Clinton Electric Company,  
6 the Dexter Electric Company, the Skowhegan Electric  
7 Light Company, the Kennebec Light & Heat Company and  
8 the Vassalborough Electric Light & Power Company is

9 hereby ratified, approved and declared legal and valid,  
10 and said Central Maine Power Company shall have, possess,  
11 exercise and enjoy in its own name all said plants, prop-  
12 erty, rights, privileges and franchises as though originally  
13 granted to it, except that it shall have no authority to issue  
14 further stocks, securities or obligations of any kind in the  
15 name of any of said companies.

Sect. 2. The Waterville & Fairfield Railway & Light  
2 Company and the Union Gas & Electric Company or either  
3 of them shall be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of  
4 section thirty-one, chapter forty-seven of the Revised Stat-  
5 utes or may be dissolved in accordance with law.
