IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to the Superintending School Committee of  
the City of Bath.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Chapter two hundred and forty-five of the  
2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-  
3 one, and all acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto,  
4 are hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. The municipal officers of the city of Bath for the  
2 year nineteen hundred and fourteen shall, at the time when  
3 other subordinate city officers are elected, elect a superin-  
4 tending school committee of three members, one of whom  
5 shall serve for one year, one for two years and one for

6 three years; and each year thereafter said municipal officers  
7 shall elect one member of said committee to serve for three  
8 years. Said committee shall have, exercise and perform all  
9 the powers and duties, and be subject to all the obligations  
10 and liabilities imposed upon such committees by the laws of  
11 the State.

Sect. 3. This act shall not take effect if the Act to provide  
2 a charter for the city of Bath, enacted in the year nineteen  
3 hundred and thirteen, shall be accepted by said city of Bath,  
4 as therein provided. If said Act shall not be so accepted  
5 then this act shall thereupon be in full force and effect.
