STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to fix the salaries of certain public officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The justice of the superior court of the county
2 of Kennebec shall receive an annual salary of thirty-five
3 hundred dollars.

Sect. 2. The justice of the superior court of the county
2 of Cumberland shall receive an annual salary of four thou-
3 sand dollars.

Sect. 3. The assistant attorney general shall receive an
2 annual salary of two thousand dollars.

Sect. 4. The secretary of state shall receive an annual
2 salary of three thousand dollars.

Sect. 5. The deputy secretary of state shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 6. The librarian of the state library shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 7. The chief clerk in the office of treasurer of state shall be designated as "deputy treasurer of state" and shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 8. The adjutant general shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars.

Sect. 9. The chief clerk in the office of state superintendent of schools shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 10. The insurance commissioner shall receive an annual salary of twenty-five hundred dollars.

Sect. 11. The deputy insurance commissioner shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 12. The deputy bank commissioner shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 13. The commissioner of agriculture shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars.

Sect. 14. The chief clerk of the land agent and forest commissioner department, designated as deputy forest commissioner, shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars.

Sect. 15. The commissioner of labor and industry shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars.

Sect. 16. The private secretary of the Governor shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars, and shall devote his entire time to the duties of the office.

Sect. 17. The messenger to the Governor's Council shall receive an annual salary of two thousand dollars, in full for all services by him performed. The council shall determine what services he shall perform.

Sect. 18. Said salaries shall be paid in equal monthly payments on the last day of each month and shall be in full for all official services.

Sect. 19. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.
