## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Town of Perry.

*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of ninety-five dollars and five cents for the purpose 3 of reimbursing the town of Perry for money paid out on 4 account of expenses of the last sickness and death of one 5 George R. Cook, an alien and State pauper.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

George R. Cook was born in England in 1848. Came to America in 1862. Lived in Perry, Cooper, Milltown and Eastport, Me., at different times, with some time spent in New Hampshire. His parents never lived in this country and Cook was never married or naturalized. Diligent search fails to disclose that he ever gained a residence in any of the several towns in which he resided. Cook came to Perry finally in 1912 from Eastport and fell into distress by reason of sickness. Expenses of sickness and death to the amount of \$95.05 were borne by the Town of Perry, for which reimbursement is now asked.
