STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Lizzie Bean.

Resolved. That there be and hereby is appropriated three 2 hundred dollars per annum for the years nineteen hundred 3 and fifteen and nineteen hundred and sixteen, the said money 4 to be paid Lizzie Bean of Passadumkeag in quarterly pay-5 ments of seventy-five dollars each under the supervision of 6 the governor and council.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Morris Bean of Passadumkeag, husband of Lizzie Bean, while in pursuance of his duty as a constable of said town, on the morning of January 18th, 1913, was shot and instantly killed by Edward DuPlissis, whom he was attempting to arrest upon a criminal charge. Bean had served his town and state as a constabe for several years. He left a wife, Lizzie Bean, and two children, aged respectively two and four years. The Legislature of 1913 granted Mrs. Bean three hundred dollars per annum for each of the years nineteen hundred and thirteen and fourteen (see Chap. 219, Resolves of 1913). Unless assistance is rendered Mrs. Bean she will be destitute and dependent upon charity.
