STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mary Allen.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated three
2 hundred dollars per annu for the years nineteen hundred
3 and fifteen and nineteen hundred and sixteen, the said sum
4 to be paid Mary Allen of Bowdoinham in quarterly pay-
5 ments of forty-eight dollars each, under the supervision of
6 the Governor and Council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mary Allen is the daughter of David Small, who was a private in Co. G., 31st Maine Regiment. He was killed at battle of the Wilderness in 1862.

She has been a widow for thirteen years and is now a woman without visible means of support and is unable to perform hard, manual labor on account of a deformity of her hands. She lives alone and has no family to give her support. For this reason she claims to be entitled to state aid and asks that the Maine Legislature grant it to her.
