STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Town of Merrill to aid in building
a bridge.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) to aid in rebuilding a
3 bridge in the Town of Merrill in the County of Aroostook
4 on the road running east and west on the line between Dyer
5 Brook and Merrill, provided that there be raised and appro-
6 priated by said town the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200)
7 for the same purpose, both sums, or so much as may be
8 necessary for building said bridge, be expended under the
9 supervision of the State Highway Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge is about one and one-half miles from Smyrna Mills Village on the direct road to Moro and Patten, and it will be about twenty-six (26) feet long, on low land, and it will be necessary to raise it, at least, two feet above the present location of the old bridge. All the traffic from Hersey and Moro and part of Dyer Brook goes over this road to market.
