STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution Giving Political Rights to Women upon Equal Terms with Men.

Resolved, two-thirds of the legislature concurring, that the 2 following amendment to the Constitution of this State be 3 proposed for the action of the legal voters, to wit, by adding

4 thereto the following article:

The right to vote or to hold office shall not be denied or 6 abridged on account of sex. In the construction of this 7 Constitution the masculine pronoun shall be construed as in-8 cluding both men and women.

'Section one of article two of this Constitution is amended 10 by striking out the word "male" in the first line of said 11 section.'

Resolved. That the aldermen of cities, the selectmen of 13 towns, and the assessors of the several plantations in this 14 state are hereby empowered and directed to notify the in-15 habitants of their respective cities, towns, and plantations 16 in the manner prescribed by law to give in their votes at the 17 next general election upon the amendment proposed in the 18 foregoing resolution, and the question shall be: "Shall the 19 Constitution be amended as proposed by a resolution of the 20 legislature giving political rights to women upon equal terms 21 with men?"

And the inhabitants of said cities, towns, and plantations 23 shall vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of the 24 amendment expressing it by the word "Yes" upon their bal-25 lots and those opposed to the amendment by the word "No" 26 upon their ballots, and the ballots shall be assorted, counted, 27 and declared in open ward, town, and plantation meetings, 28 and returns made to the office of secretary of state in the 29 same manner as votes for governor and members of the 30 legislature, and the governor and council shall count the 31 same and make returns to the next legislature, and if it 32 shall appear that a majority of the votes are in favor of the 33 amendment, the Constitution shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved. That the secretary of state shall prepare and 35 furnish to the several cities, towns, and plantations ballots 36 and blank returns in conformity with the foregoing resolves 37 accompanied by a copy thereof.
