STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to prohibit the importation of Intoxicating Liquors into the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall at any time, by himself, his

- 2 clerk, servant or agent, directly or indirectly import into the
- 3 State of Maine from any other state in the United Sates, or
- 4 from any foreign country, any intoxicating liquors of what-
- 5 ever origin, including wine, ale, porter, lager beer, and all
- 6 other malt liquors: (except for medicinal, sacramental,
- 7 scientific, and mechanical purposes under restrictions pre-
- 8 scribed by law): and all such liquors, as well as all distilled

- 9 spirits, are declared intoxicating within the meaning of this 10 law. But their enumeration shall not prevent any other pure 11 or mixed liquors from being so considered intoxicating.
 - Sect. 2. Possession of intoxicating liquor, as defined and 2 enumerated in Section 1 of this Act, shall be prima facie 3 evidence of illegal importation.
 - Sect. 3. Whoever violates the provisions of this Act shall 2 be punished by imprisonment of not less than thirty days nor 3 more than one year.
