STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT relative to the compensation of Judges of Probate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any Judge of Probate having attained the age
2 of at least seventy years and having served as Judge of
3 Probate for at least twenty years, resigns his said office or
4 ceases to serve at the expiration of any term of said office,
5 shall during the remainder of his life, receive an amount
6 equal to one-half of the salary which is by law payable to
7 him at the time of such resignation or termination of service;
8 which shall be paid to him from the State Treasury in

9 quarterly payments on the first days of January, April, July
10 and October. The provisions of this act shall apply to
11 present and former Judges of Probate and take effect from
12 the first day of January, A. D. 1917.
