STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE in favor of Gardiner and Randolph Bridge for maintenance and repairs.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars for the 2 year nineteen hundred seventeen and one thousand dollars 3 for the year nineteen hundred eighteen, be appropriated for 4 the repairs and maintenance of said bridge.

The city of Gardiner and town of Randolph have expended on the Gardiner and Randolph bridge as follows:

Original cost of Gardiner and Randolph bridge to	
Gardiner and Randolph was	\$22,671 00
Cost of maintenance and repairs for the past 27	
years	94,042 75
Average cost per year for 27 years	3,483 07
It will be necessary to re-plank the whole of the	
open part of the bridge at an estimated expense	
of	4,000 00

The bridge is also in need of a coat of paint which will, probably, cost from \$2,000.00 to \$2,500.00.

This bridge is nearly 900 feet long and has a draw which requires the services of two men constantly during the summer season, and one man for care-taker during the winter. It also requires the use of a team in winter to keep the roadway snowed.
