STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to provide a bounty for killing crows in the County of Washington, State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. That the treasurer of each town and city in the
County of Washington, State of Maine, may appropriate and
cause to be paid out of the town or city treasury a sum not
exceeding ten cents to any person who shall deliver to the
treasurer of the town or city the head of any common crow: *Provided*, That such person shall first subscribe an oath that
the crow to which such head belonged was killed in the
County of Washington, State of Maine.
