STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT additional to Chapter thirty-three of the Revised Statutes (1916) relating to hunting from automobiles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, chase, catch,

- 2 kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal at any time from
- 3 an automobile, or by aid or use of any light or lights carried
- 4 thereon or attached thereto. It shall also be unlawful for
- 5 any person to have in possession at any time any wild bird or
- 6 wild animal, or part thereof, taken in violation of any pro-

- 7 vision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this
- 8 act shall pay a fine of not less than forty dollars nor more
- 9 than one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.
