STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter four of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen entitled An Act to Regulate the Taking of Smelts in the Waters of Egypt Bay, Franklin Bay, Taunton Bay and River in the towns of Hancock, Franklin and Sullivan in Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter four of the Private and Special
2 Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen entitled An Act to
3 Regulate the Taking of Smelts in the Waters of Egypt Bay,
4 Franklin Bay, Taunton Bay and River in the towns of Han-
5 cock, Franklin and Sullivan, in Hancock County, is hereby

6 amended by striking out all of said section after the word
7 “above” in the fourth line of said section and substituting
8 therefor the following: ‘a line drawn from the Mount
9 Desert Ferry Steamboat Wharf easterly to the northern end
10 of Ingall’s Island and continuing in a straight line to the
11 town of Sorrento, in the towns of Hancock, Franklin, Sulli-
12 van and Sorrento,’ so that said section as amended, shall
13 read as follows:

‘Section 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking
2 any smelts, except by hook and line, in the waters of Egypt
3 Bay, Franklin Bay, Taunton Bay and River and their tribu-
4 taries, lying above a line drawn from the Mount Desert
5 Ferry Steamboat Wharf easterly to the northern end of
6 Ingall’s Island and continuing in a straight line to the town
7 of Sorrento, in the towns of Hancock, Franklin, Sullivan
8 and Sorrento.’
