STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, appropriating money for the care and maintenance of Fort William Henry in the town of Bristol.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the 2 care and maintenance of the memorial tower erected by the 3 state at Fort William Henry, and for the preservation and 4 improvement of the property of the state at said fort, the 5 sum of twelve hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred 6 seventeen, and the sum of six hundred dollars for the year 7 nineteen hundred eighteen; said sums to be expended under 8 the direction of the commissioners of the state in charge of 9 said fort.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The ancient Fort William Henry at Pemaquid in the town of Bristol is the property of the state. From a condition of dilapidation and neglect it has been placed in very good repair and is attracting an increasing number of sightseers from all over the country, every year.
