IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of Joseph H. Underwood of Fayette, to reimburse him for money paid out for testing of his cattle in 1915, after the Sanitary Commissioner of Maine had refused and neglected to act as required by law.

Resolved: That the sum of One Hundred dollars be ap-2 propriated and paid to Joseph H. Underwood of Fayette for 3 the purpose of reimbursing him for money paid out in 1915 4 by him for the purpose of testing his cattle after Boyden 5 Bearce, Sanitary Commissioner of the State of Maine had 6 refused to take action in regard to said herd of cattle as re-7 quired by law, after being requested so to do, by Mr. Under-
