STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of Teacher's School and Hospital on Indian Island, Oldtown, Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of \$2425 be appropriated to the 2 following purpose:

To renovate and change the building known as Teachers'

- 2 Old Home. For the purpose of having a social center and a
- 3 place where the Indians both old and young can be taught
- 4 domestic science and sewing. Also to furnish some of the
- 5 room for a hospital and a home for aged and infirm women
- 6 or sick children who may seek such a home.

This money to be expended under the direction of the 2 teachers on Indian Island, \$2425.

The appropriation for domestic science is asked of the Leg2 islature because many of the young Indians can in this way
3 be saved from frequenting objectionable places outside of the
4 Island as they now do.

The lower part of the building should be used as a social 2 center for the tribe, especially for the young women where 3 they may meet for social purposes and receive lessons in 4 domestic science, which lessons will be given by the teachers 5 in charge, free from any expense to the state.

The upper part of the building is adequate for a hospital, 2 since practically all of the surgical cases go to the Eastern 3 Maine General Hospital in Bangor, where they have the attention of skilled physicians at a minimum cost. When these 3 men go to the Island it means a very heavy expense to the 6 parties having them and the Indians themselves prefer to go 7 to the Eastern Maine General Hospital. Another advantage 8 is that if there happen to be any aged Indians there will be 9 sufficient room to take care of them in this building, since it 10 is characteristic of the Indian to be tenacious of their homes 11 regardless of their surroundings.
