- AN ACT to amend Section Thirty-Eight of Chapter Forty-Five of the Revised Statutes, relating to Length of Lobsters that may be Canned.
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
 Section thirty-eight of chapter forty-five of the Revised
 2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the second line
 3 thereof, the words "and three fourths," so that said section
 4 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 38. No person shall can lobsters less than four 2 inches in length, alive or dead, measured in accordance with

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3 section thirty-five; and for every lobster canned contrary to 4 the provisions of this section, every person, firm, associa-5 tion or corporation so canning shall be liable to a penalty of 6 one dollar for every lobster so canned, and a further penalty 7 of three hundred dollars for every day on which such un-8 lawful canning is carried on.'
