STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section nine of Chapter one hundred twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to trespasses on improved lands, how to be punished.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section nine of Chapter one hundred twenty-nine of the
Revised Statutes is hereby further amended by inserting
after the words "blueberry ground," in the third line thereof,
the words 'arboretum, botanic garden'; also by inserting after
the word "shrubs" in the fifth line thereof, the words,
'plants, flowers,' so that said section, as amended, shall read
as follows:

SENATE-No. 167.

'Sect. 19. Whoever wilfully commits any trespass, or 2 knowingly authorizes or employs another to do so, by enter-3 ing the garden, orchard, pasture, cranberry ground, im-4 proved blueberry ground, arboretum, botanic garden, or im-5 proved land, of another, with intent to take, carry away, 6 destroy or injure trees, shrubs, plants, flowers, grain, grass, 7 hay, fruit, vegetables, turf or soil thereon, shall be punished 8 by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, and imprison-9 ment for not more than ninety days.'
