STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Sections 17, 18 and 21 of Chapter 127 of
the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Manufacture and Sale
of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 17 of chapter 127 is hereby amended
2 by striking out the words "except cider" in the second and
3 third lines, so that said section when amended shall read
4 as follows:

'Sect. 17. Whoever manufactures for sale any intoxicat-
2 ing liquors, and whoever sells any intoxicating liquors man-
3 factured by him in this state, shall be imprisoned two
4 months and fined one thousand dollars.'

Sect. 2. Section 18 of chapter 127 is hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. Section 21 of chapter 127 is hereby amended by
2 striking out after the word "liquors," in the third line, the
3 words "and cider when kept or deposited with intent to sell
4 the same for tippling purposes, or as a beverage," so that
5 section when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 21. No person shall at any time, by himself, his
2 clerk, servant or agent, directly or indirectly, sell any in-
3 toxicating liquors, of whatever origin; wine, ale, porter,
4 strong beer, lager beer and all other malt liquors as well
5 as all distilled spirits, are declared intoxicating within the
6 meaning of this chapter; but this enumeration shall not
7 prevent any other pure or mixed liquors from being con-
8 sidered intoxicating.'
