AN ACT to Amend Section Forty of Chapter One Hundred  
Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, to Increase the Compensation of the Clerk of Courts in Aroostook County.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty of chapter one hundred seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the sixth line thereof the words "two thousand," and substituting therefor the words 'twenty-five hundred,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 40. Compensation of clerks of courts. 1915, c. 148;

2 c. 335. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several coun-  
3 ties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the  
4 counties in quarterly payments on the first days of Jan-  
5 uary, April, July and October, as follows:

Androscoggin, two thousand dollars.

Aroostook, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Cumberland, two thousand five hundred dollars; deputy  
2 clerk of courts, eighteen hundred dollars.

Franklin, twelve hundred dollars.

Hancock, two thousand one hundred dollars; beginning  
2 with the first day of January, nineteen hundred and nine-  
3 teen, eighteen hundred dollars.

Kennebec, two thousand three hundred and fifty dollars.

Knox, thirteen hundred dollars.

Lincoln, one thousand dollars.

Oxford, sixteen hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, twelve hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, seventeen hundred dollars.

Somerset, eighteen hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, fifteen hundred dollars; beginning with the  
2 first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventeen, four-  
3 teen hundred and fifty dollars.

York, nineteen hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation  
2 for the performance of all duties required of clerks, includ-

3 ing those performed by them as clerks of the supreme judi-  
4 cial court, superior and county commissioners' courts, or  
5 by clerks pro tempore, employed by them. They shall ac-  
6 count quarterly under oath to the county treasurers for all  
7 fees received by them or payable to them by virtue of the  
8 office, except fees collected by them in naturalization pro-  
9 ceedings under the act of Congress of June twenty-ninth,  
10 nineteen hundred six, as amended by act of Congress of  
11 June twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred ten, specifying the  
12 items, and shall pay the whole amount of the same to the  
13 treasurers of their respective counties quarterly on the first  
14 days of January, April, July and October of each year.'
