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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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AN ACT to amend section 35 of chapter 126 of the Revised Statutes, relating to Sunday observance.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 35 of chapter 126 of the revised statutes of Maine 2 1916 be hereby amended by inserting the words 'without 3 the consent of the municipal officers of this city or select- 4 men of this town,' after the word "day" so that said section 5 of said chapter, when amended, shall read as follows:

'Whoever, on the Lord's day, without the consent of the 2 municipal officers of his city or selectmen of his town, keeps 3 open his shop, work-house, warehouse or place of business, 4 travels, or does any work, labor or business on that day, ex-

5 cept works of necessity or charity; uses any sport, game or  
6 recreation; or is present at any dancing, public diversion,  
7 show or entertainment, encouraging the same, shall be pun-  
8 ished by fine not exceeding ten dollars.'
