STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to amend section eleven of chapter two hundred eleven of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-five as amended by chapter one hundred one of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred nine and chapter one hundred forty-six of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred fifteen relating to Clerk Hire in the Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 11 of chapter 211 of the private and special laws
2 1895 as amended by chapter 101 of the private and special
3 laws of 1909 and chapter 146 of the private and special laws
4 of 1915, is hereby further amended by adding at the end of

5 said section the following provision, 'and in addition thereto
6 there shall be provided the sum of seven hundred fifty dollars
7 a year for clerk hire to be paid monthly from the said treas-
8 ury, provided however, that the county commissioners of
9 said county may in their discretion expend a larger amount,
10 not exceeding five hundred dollars per year, for the employ-
11 ment of extra clerks,' so that said section as amended shall
12 read as follows :

'Sect. 11. Said court shall be held at such places as the city
2 of Bangor shall provide and said city shall have power and it
3 shall be its duty to raise money and provide a proper place
4 for said court and its officers and suitably furnish, warm and
5 light the same, for which there shall be paid from the county
6 of Penobscot, as rental in quarterly payments, the sum of
7 one thousand dollars annually. The salaries of the judge
8 and clerk thereof which are hereby fixed at eighteen hundred
9 dollars and fifteen hundred dollars, respectively, to be paid
10 quarterly, with all other expenses of said court, shall be
11 paid from the treasury of the county of Penobscot and in
12 addition thereto there shall be provided the sum of seven
13 hundred fifty dollars a year for clerk hire, to be paid monthly
14 from said treasury, provided however, that the county com-
15 missioners of said county may, in their discretion, expend
16 a larger amount, not exceeding five hundred dollars per
17 year, for the employment of extra clerks.'
