IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Hahnel Bros. & Co., for Labor and Material Furnished by Them in the Construction of the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in
2 favor of Hahnel Bros. & Co. the sum of five hundred and
3 eighty-eight dollars and seventy-eight cents, in payment
4 of their bill for that amount for labor and materials fur-
5 nished by them in the construction of the Women's Re-
6 formatory, at Skowhegan.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Hahnel Bros. & Co. are a copartnership having an office and place of business in Lewiston. They were requested to furnish materials on the Women's Reformatory at Skowhegan, and interviewed Hon. Clyde H. Smith, a resident of Skowhegan, and who was chairman of the building committee of the Women's Reformatory building. Hahnel Bros. & Co., before furnishing any of the material which was requested by Wilbur & Co., of Bangor, asked Mr. Smith, chairman, with reference to the furnishing of it and getting their pay, and they were informed by Smith to go ahead and furnish the materials as called for and that the State of Maine would see that they got their pay. They furnished the bills according to the itemized statement appended hereto.

Wilbur & Son went into bankruptcy. They (Hahnel Bros. & Co.) did this work upon the said structure with the distinct understanding on the part of the chairman of the building commission that the state would be responsible for it.
