STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT Amending Section Forty-one, Chapter Thirty-six,
of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Department of Agri-
culture, Providing for the Collection and Examination of
Samples of Feeding Stuffs, Fertilizers, Insecticides, Seeds,
Foods and Drugs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amend section 41, chapter 36, revised statutes, by strik-
2 ing out the word "nine" in line two and substituting the
3 word 'twelve,' so that said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 41. Appropriation. 1909, c. 115, 1. 1913, c. 140,
2 1. The sum of twelve thousand dollars shall be annually
3 appropriated in favor of the commissioner of agriculture,

4 and the same shall be expended by the commissioner in
5 executing the laws relating to the collection, examination,
6 inspection and analysis of agricultural seeds, concentrated
7 commercial feeding stuffs, commercial fertilizer, and foods
8 and drugs. Payments of said appropriation shall be made
9 quarterly upon the warrants of the governor and council.
10 The commissioner shall annually publish a classified ac-
11 count of all receipts and expenditures under this section.'
