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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

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AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter Ten of the Re-  
vised Statutes, Relating to Exemption from Poll Taxes.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter ten of the revised statutes is here-  
2 by amended by striking out the words "above the age of  
3 twenty-one" in the second line thereof and inserting in  
4 place thereof the words 'between the ages of twenty-one  
5 and seventy,' so that said section as amended shall read as  
6 follows:

'Sect. 1. A poll-tax shall be assessed upon every male  
2 inhabitant of the state between the ages of twenty-one and

3 seventy years whether a citizen of the United States or  
4 an alien, in the manner provided by law, unless he is ex-  
5 empted therefrom by this chapter, which said poll-tax shall  
6 not exceed three dollars and shall not be less than one dol-  
7 lar.'
