STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Livermore.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the
2 sum of sixty-seven dollars and sixty-one cents, to be paid to
3 the town of Livermore, for the purpose of reimbursing said
4 town for money paid out on account of the family of George
5 C. Buck, of the 2d. Maine Infantry, Company G, while he
6 was serving in the U. S. Army, on the Mexican border, from
7 June 22d, 1916, to September 12th, 1916.

This certifies that George C. Buck and family were living in the town of Livermore at the time he was called to serve the United States down on the Mexican border, as shown in resolve attached, and that the town of Livermore contributed the sum of sixty-seven and 51-100 dollars (\$67.51) to the support of his family during his absence.
