STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Inhabitants of the Town of Industry, Franklin County, Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of ninety dollars and twenty-2 eight cents be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to 3 the treasurer of the town of Industry, Franklin county, 4 Maine, to reimburse said town for money paid Mae J. 5 Smith.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mae J. Smith is the mother of Earl Welcome Smith, a soldier in the service of the United States of America from July 1, 1918, to December 5, 1918; that the said Mae J. Smith is aged, infirm and dependent, although only 53 years of age. She was absolutely dependent upon her son for support before his entering into the service, and to keep her from becoming a town pauper while her son was in the service of his country the town of Industry paid her \$4 per week for 22 and 4-7 weeks, amounting to \$90.28.
