STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-eight of Chapter Four of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Purposes for Which Cities and Towns May Raise Money.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section fifty-eight of chapter four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the ninth line of said section fifty-eight after the word "sixty-one" the words 'and in the war with Germany and other Central European Powers,' so that said section fifty-eight as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 58. Cities and towns may raise money to procure the writing and publication of their histories, to celebrate

3 any centennial or other anniversary of the settlement or
4 incorporation of such city or town, and to publish the pro-
5 ceedings of any such celebration; to defray the expenses
6 of the observance of Memorial Day, Firemen's Memorial
7 Sunday, and of Old Home Week; and a sum not exceed-
8 ing five thousand dollars in any one town for erecting a
9 suitable monument in memory of the soldiers and sailors
10 who sacrificed their lives in defense of their country in
11 the war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one and in the war
12 with Germany and other Central European Powers and a
13 reasonable sum to secure, grade and care for a lot appro-
14 priate for such a monument. They may also raise money
15 to be expended for exterminating or controlling brown-
16 tail and gypsy moths and other insect pests.'
